The Greatest Pep Rally Ever

This article appeared in the December 1970 Oriole. It was written by student Jim Doyle.

The last pep rally of the football season was a most unforgetable one. This is one reporters account of that assembly.

You will not be obligated to attend the pep rally. Seniors that have an early dismissal may leave at the end of sixth period. Those seniors wishing to attend the rally and all others who have an early dismissal will proceed to the cafeteria at the end of 6th period.

This was the announcement which preceded the pep rally November 20th. A pep rally which was destined to be the greatest in the history of the school.

It started as all this year, threatening to be dull and listless, but soon after it began that feeling evaporated. The catalyst was Brother Doyle who spoke from his heart. Personal feelings that could be nothing but sincere. The students and faculty here at Leo are my family. There is no place on this earth I would rather be

than Leo. Leo is everything. Leo is not black, Leo is not white, there are no divisions at Leo. Leo is one and Leo is great. A cheer went up in the gym, a wall of solid spirit, which threatened to blow the roof off. We're number one we're number one! Index fingers pointed to heaven, voices releasing pent up emotions. An emotional Brother Doyle speaks again, You know a brother is required to take a vow of poverty, but you couldn't give me a million dollars for what I just experienced. I am proud to teach at Leo, it gives me the opportunity to associate with the best kind of men in the world. That's a Leo man. He is so filled with emotion now he is beginning to get misty. Everyone identifies with him, because everyone feels the same as he does. His emotions climax. Beat Rita, Beat Rita! Begins as Brother heads for the exit. Pete Kammolz returns to the mike. He introduces the guest speaker, former Leo coach Jim Arneberg. Handsome Jim, Handsome Jim!. The coach speaks of spirit. It's the same old Leo. There's something intangible about a Leo pep rally. It brings together the greatest bunch of guys in the world. Leo has the greatest tradition of spirit, a spirit which has been a part of my life since I was in grade school. The coach speaks on. He relates stories about Fitzgerald, Hanlon, Foster and other great molders of the Leo Legend. He ends with an address to the team and though he steps away from the mike his volume is not lessened. I want you to remember that when you take the field Sunday, if you see the opportunity to gain another yard, you gain another yard or ten yards if needed. Don't ease up, gain those ten yards. Nothing else of what he said could be heard. The students erupted into "We want city show no pity!!!!!" They cheered as Pete Kammholz came to the speaker's stand. He, too, spoke from the soul as you know this was not a mandatory pep rally for the seniors. Many students didn't bother to come. I want to say we don't need those guys. They don't belong here anyway. Leo consists only of those students who are here now only the students who care are Leo men. Then the long awaited moment arrived. Two fingers were thrust into the air as Pete invited the student body to sing Leo's symbol of student participation, the Fight Song. After several choruses, Brother Gremley stepped up to the mike in a futile attempt to dismiss the group but how can one turn off something which took months to build? He finally gave up amid Lions, Lions, clap, clap, clap, clap! Now that the time was theirs, the students wouldn't be denied their wish. A new cry was taken up. "We want Foster, We want Foster" was their cry. They shouted for about 5 minutes before a glimpse of the coach in the hall w seen. His face appeared and immediately "Handsome F

Handsome Bob!" became their cry. Then Mr. Foster spoke. I was forced to leave because I was so emotional that I was afraid I would embarrass myself. I would like to say though that I have been associated with this school for many years. I want you to know that I have never seen such a show of spirit in all of my years. This is the greatest pep rally this gym has ever seen. I can see that you are emotionally involved in this game. Once more index fingers point to heaven "We're number one, we're number one!" Was their cry again. Mr. Foster's finger also pointed skyward. He also had to exit for apparently something had gotten into his eyes. Another futile attempt was made at dismissal. Another call was taken up. Szwast was summoned. Then Davido, Donnellan and Narish. They either talked slowly or slurred their words as their emotions had overcome them. But their message was clear. Rita had already lost as far as they were concerned. Brother Gremley tried to dismiss them again but he had to wait once more. "V-I-C-I-O-U-S are we, vicious, hell ves." Fifteen minutes later it was Mr. Foster who had the last words. This has been something fabulous but all good things must come to an end. If we keep this up, we will miss practice. But this will not end. It will continue until Sunday when you same bunch of guys will cheer us to a Catholic League Championship.

It thus ended. But did it? Leo spirit, such as was demonstrated here, has been since 1926 and will be until 79th and Sangamon exists no more. And even then it will be remembered forever as the remnants of Leo Graduates achievements will always exist for all the world to see.

I received a letter from Father Tom Mescall '65. Father Tom advised me of a touching story involving Ed Ryan Leo High School Class of 1959. Ed taught at St. Denis for 45 years. He lived a single life in very humble surroundings. Ed dedicated his life to Catholic Education. Every day from his Catholic schools pension check and Social Security he sent a twenty five dollar donation to some Catholic Charity.

This type of lifetime generosity took its toll on his finances and Ed died penniless. This may be one of the greatest examples we as Leo men may have of the true meaning of our motto "Facta Non Verba".

St. Denis, a wonderful Catholic Church with strong ties in the past to Leo High School stepped forward and despite a dwindling budget provided a Christian burial for Ed. However that parish can ill afford not to be reimbursed. Ed only had one family when he died, the men of Leo. Unfortunately, as an alumni association our not for profit charter would not allow us to contribute as a group to this cause. However I was hoping that if I brought this to your attention a number of you might see fit to contribute. If you would like to contribute, please make your check payable to Leo High School Alumni Association but clearly make your intention known that it is to be used for the Ryan Burial Fund.

Golf Update

We just completed another very successful golf outing. My special thanks to Joan Howard for making it happen.




