USMC WWII Medal of Honor Hero Remembered

Hundreds of people gathered at Holy Sepulchre Cemetery near Chicago to honor Marine Corps Corporal John P. Fardy who received the Medal of Honor for actions during the invasion of Okinawa in World War II. Among those celebrating Fardy's heroics were descendents, veterans groups, classmates and other alumni from Leo High School where Fardy graduated from in 1940.

Fardy was injured on May 6, 1945 and died from his wounds the next day. Fardy was recommended for the Medal of Honor by his Platoon Leader and as typical of Medal of Honor investigations, successive people in the chain of command right up to President Harry S. Truman, recommended Fardy to receive the Medal of Honor. Fardy's parents received the Medal of Honor in 1946 and his body was not repatriated from Okinawa and reinterred until 1949. His headstone is simple and until recently gave no indication that Fardy received the Medal of Honor.

So for over six decades, tens of thousands of people visiting one of Chicago's largest cemeteries would not know of the courage and bravery of the Marine buried there.

Dr. Terence Barrett, historian and author of *The Forgotten 34*, *Honored by the Marine Corps but Forgotten by their Hometowns* brought this headstone oversight to the Leo Alumni Association. Vietnam Veteran and fellow Leo grad Jim Furlong (Leo 65) formed a committee with fellow Leo grads David Lee (Leo 85) and Coach Mike Holmes (Leo 76) to correct the oversight and rededicate the headstone for Fardy's honor. Soon the headstone was re-engraved with the Medal of Honor Badge and the text "Medal of Honor".

On August 8, 2011, with Full Military Honors, Cpl. Fardy's headstone was rededicated. An Honor Guard Detachment from the 2nd Battalion, 24th Marine Division presented Colors and presented a flag to descendents of Cpl. Fardy including Fardy's nephew and namesake, John Martin (Leo 67). Other participants in the program were Fr. Tom Mescall (Leo 65) who gave the invocation, 10 year old Shane Crean who sang the National Anthem, Irish National Anthem-A Soldiers Song (in Gaelic) and the Marine Corps Hymm (all a capella), the Marine Corps League who rendered a 21 gun salute tribute, The Military Order of Purple Heart who presented descendents with a Purple Heart/Medal of Honor Plaque; Tom Day, USMC retired, bugler and founder of Bugles Across America who performed a stirring rendition of TAPS, and bagpipper Jim Bruenner who greeted the gathering crowd with the Marine Corps Hymn, played Amazing Grace during the Ceremony and piped Oh Danny Boy as the group retired. Participants also placed about 200 American Flags around the newly engraved headstone as they left.

Dr. Barrett was guest speaker and noted that Cpl. Fardy went to an academically challenging school (Leo) yet was otherwise undistinguished. But that he worked hard to achieve all that he did. And his hard work and dedication was the epitome of a Marine. Drafted by the Marine Corps in 1943, Fardy volunteered for Japanese language school and also volunteered for training and became proficient in the use of the Browning Automatic Rifle (BAR). As Dr. Barrett noted, this "assured" Fardy of action in the Pacific Theatre.

On May 6, 1945 a veteran of two earlier Pacific Island invasions (Cape Gloucester and Peleliu) Fardy, promoted to Corporal, was leading his squad up a hill against heavily fortified enemy fire. Taking temporary refuge in a drainage ditch to regroup his squad, the enemy threw a hand grenade in the Marine Squad's midst. The Medal of Honor Citation goes on: "Instantly throwing himself upon the deadly missile, Corporal Fardy absorbed the exploding blast in his own body, thereby protecting his comrades from certain and perhaps fatal injuries. Concerned solely for the welfare of his men, he willingly relinquished his own hope of survival that his fellow Marines might live to carry on the fight against a fanatic enemy. A stouthearted leader and indomitable fighter, Corporal Fardy, by his prompt

decision and resolute spirit of self-sacrifice in the face of certain death, had rendered valiant service, and his conduct throughout reflects the highest credit upon himself and the United States Naval Service. He gallantly gave his life for his country."

And true to his courageous spirit and indomitable will, Cpl. Fardy continued to fight. Though gravely wounded he resisted death until finally succumbing to his wounds on May 7, 1945.

SEMPER FIDELIS

The Leo High School motto also has its roots in Latin - Facta non Verba - Deeds not words. Cpl. Fardy's deeds on May 6, 1945 are the embodiment of this motto.
