Heroes

When I was growing up as a young man at Leo High School, I had a number of heroes. My heroes were my father, Richard P. Furlong, a World War 2 veteran, who didn't go to Leo but worked hard so his three sons could. I also looked up to Jim Arneberg. Jim was another World War 2 veteran. A decorated Marine. He was my freshman homeroom and history teacher, the head basketball and football

coach at Leo and a man whom I am proud to say I maintained a relationship with until his early death.

Finally, I was very fortunate to have great friends and mentors amongst the Christian Brothers of Ireland. First was Brother Coogan, who had the unenviable task of trying to teach me Latin. Not only was he able to teach me Latin he took the time along the way to become a friend. Brother Finnerty was another who comes to mind. He was the A.D. at Leo as well as English and History teacher. Anytime I had the need to talk or seek guidance I stopped into his classroom after school and he spent however long it took to help me resolve my problems. He was another true friend and hero. And while there were many more, the names Birmingham, McAdams and McCormick stick out. All men who had a vocation and stuck to it above and beyond. These are people who 50 years later still have an influence over who I have become.

I am however troubled about news coming out of Ireland. Members of the Christian Brothers and nuns from the Sisters of Mercy are being investigated for cruel and unimaginable torture of young children who were entrusted to their care. The investigations have been completed and the reports are in and there can be no doubt the above took place.

This is extremely troubling for me. I have been torn. What can you believe in anymore? In today's world, we hear allegations of wrongdoing against policemen and firemen. We all know of the scandal regarding priests around the world and now our beloved brothers.

I have sorted this out in my mind. I will pray for the very unfortunate victims who must undergo a lifetime of anguish. I will even pray for the predators who caused them that anguish. May God find it in his heart how to deal with those people. However, I will not lose sight of the fact that the great majority of people in the professions previously cited are decent and honorable people.

I choose to honor policemen who go to work in the streets each night all night facing danger so that the rest of us can sleep safely in our homes.

I choose to honor firemen such as those who rushed into the World Trade Center while everyone else was run-

ning out. They knew their job and chose to do it even though they would never go home to their loved ones again.

I choose to honor priests who sit in hospital waiting rooms at 3 a.m. with family members, giving comfort while a loved one dies.

And finally I choose to honor the Christian Brothers of Ireland, most of whom molded young men at important times in their lives. They were teachers, mentors, friends and heroes.
