

## Letter From The President (Leo H.S.)

Our efforts to ensure that Leo remains a thriving School of Opportunity for today's Leo Men hit a snag in the spring when IDOT grounded two of our vehicles. The rickety old van and the sagging, dilapidated mini-bus surely didn't look like much, but they got us where we needed to go until IDOT decided a combination of age and wear-and-tear made them a safety hazard and failed them in an inspection.

Crew chief Al Townsend, who maintains the "fleet" for us, said it would cost more to fix the sad old beaters than they were worth, so we sold them for scrap.

So much for our plan to increase enrollment by providing transportation to the areas we're drawing students from, as well as other neighborhoods we'd lost touch with. Down to two vans, we couldn't even transport our sports teams without incurring large rental costs.

Sam Leno to the rescue.

Sam is a 1963 Leo grad and a faithful Leo supporter who relocated to New England after graduating from Northern Illinois University and serving as an officer in the U.S. Navy. Sam pitched the idea of an ambitious, one-time campaign to raise the money to fund our transportation needs. His son's firm provided marketing expertise, with help from some Leo students who devised the slogan---"The Lions Express to Opportunity"---and helped design the promotional brochure. Sam covered the cost of the mailing and made a generous contribution of seed money.

Thanks to Sam's leadership, Pat Hickey's execution and typical beyond-the-pale generosity of Leo Men, the campaign was a phenomenal success. It launched in late July, and within six weeks we had enough money to pay cash for a full-size school bus and a sleek, almost new mini-bus. Rental costs are a thing of the past. More important, we have three clearly identifiable "Leo" vehicles on the road covering five routes every morning and bringing more than three dozen kids to school. We plan to have another two routes covered by the end of the year, after we buy another vehicle.

All of us here are grateful beyond words. When we rolled up in the like-new, flashy-logo buses a few days ago, the kids were absolutely wide-eyed, as if they were filled with candy and Christmas presents. They're pretty excited about riding in style, particularly as a contrast from what they were used to.

There's practical value in it for us, and symbolic value as well. The new buses suggest things are happening here, that we're getting things done. And we are---all because of the most loyal, generous, supportive alumni network in the country. Sincerest thanks to all of you.

The Lions Express to Opportunity rolls on. Indeed. I'm proud to be part of it.

## Leo Update

Coach Mike Holmes believed he had the ingredients for future football success when Theo Hopkins, Solomon Jones, Juvan Lewis, Terron Bell and their classmates enrolled at Leo as freshmen three years ago. With De La Salle transfer Mike Conley joining the mix and junior Latrell Giles developing into a standout quarterback, the pieces are in place for a special season. Leo is off to a great start, with impressive victories over St. Ignatius, St. Joe's and Lake Forest Academy and a forfeit win over St. Francis de Sales, which was down to 15 players.

With two wins in its five remaining games---Fenton, Hales Franciscan, Gordon Tech, Bishop McNamara and Mt. Carmel---Leo will be assured of a berth in the IHSA state playoffs, at either the 2-A or 3-A level.

Bishop Mac, on Friday, Oct. 18, at 7:30 p.m., is the only remaining home game. The Lions have played their home schedule at the Kroc Center, a sparkling new facility located at 119th and Loomis. The Kroc Family of McDonald's fame bought the land that had been home to a Libby's canning plant, cleared it and turned it over to the Salvation Army for the express purpose of developing a youth center. Leo played eight baseball games and hosted a Class-A baseball Regional at the site last spring, and was happy to sign on as a tenant when the football field opened this fall. It's been a nice arrangement.

Leo's frosh-soph team is off to a 4-0 start as well. It helps having a smart, savvy coach's son at quarterback-freshman Aamir Holmes.

Leo extends a warm welcome to four new faculty members: Ms. Kimberly Hickey, Ms. Jean Pagliaro, Mr. Mike Anderson and Mr. Titus Redmond.

Ms. Hickey, a graduate of New Trier High School, earned her undergrad degree from Notre Dame and a Master's from the University of Pennsylvania. She prepared for her work at Leo by practice teaching at Philadelphia's Overbrook High School, best known as the alma mater of basketball great Wilt Chamberlain. Ms. Hickey is teaching freshman algebra, sophomore geometry and senior business math. She is also assisting Mike Joyce with the Leo boxing team, having learned to box by taking part in the famed Bengal Bouts intramural tournament at Notre Dame.

Ms. Pagliaro is no stranger to the South Side Catholic education scene, coming to Leo highly recommended after a distinguished career at Maria High School. She is teaching freshman Earth Science and sophomore Biology in an expanded science curriculum.

Mike Holmes' decision to concentrate on his duties as admissions director and football coach created an opening for a dean of students, and we're delighted to add Mike Anderson '93 to the faculty. Mike has been helping out with the frosh-soph football and baseball teams and is one of Leo's most energetic and successful recruiters. Having him in the building full time is a plus for Leo.

Titus Redmond, a former Gordon Tech star, is one of the most respected figures in local basketball circles. He has been assisting Noah Cannon for the last 10 years and will remain on the basketball staff while teaching English at all four grade levels. Coach Redmond is another experienced recruiter whose full-time presence will enhance our efforts to build enrollment.

While welcoming its new teachers, Leo bids a fond farewell to Bob Schablaske, who retired over the summer after 38 years as a Catholic schools teacher and coach, 25 of them at Leo. We are looking forward to honoring "Coach Schab" at a basketball game this season.

We also thank two other departing teachers for their service. English teacher Barry Isreal left Leo for the political world, and math teacher Christine Meany took a job in the suburbs after getting married and relocating.


