### **Andy McKenna Legacy Award**

Ray Siegel, who graduated from Leo with the Class of 1965, has been named the eighth recipient of the Andy McKenna Legacy Award. Ray will be honored at Leo's eighth annual Scholarship Benefit on Wednesday, Nov. 29 at the Four Seasons Chicago Hotel.

Formerly known as the Leo Lions Legacy Award, the name was changed this year to honor its first recipient, Andy McKenna '47, who died in February 2023. Mr. McKenna established himself as one of Leo's most distinguished graduates during a lifetime of service to others and was especially proud of his ties to Leo.


Leo honored Andy at the first Scholarship Benefit, held in conjunction with Leo's 90th anniversary in 2016, and a who's-who of Chicago business and civic leaders turned out to salute their friend. The inaugural event was so successful that it has become an annual affair, raising nearly \$8 million for scholarship assistance to deserving young Leo Men

"Ray joins seven other recipients of our highest honor, and he's an ideal choice to receive the award that bears Andy McKenna's name," Leo President Dan McGrath said. "Much like Andy, Ray has been one of our most loyal and generous supporters, in ways that extend beyond financial. Ray is a true role model and a true exemplar of Facta non Verba - Deeds not Words."

A graduate of St. Margaret of Scotland elementary school, Ray transferred into Leo as a junior to extend his football career after St. Ignatius dropped the sport. Over two years he became an All-Catholic League and All-City defensive lineman for the Lions.

An ankle injury sustained late in his senior year curtailed his recruiting, but Ray received a scholarship to St. Joseph's College in Rensselaer, IN., where he enjoyed a standout career under former Leo coaching legend Jim Arenberg.

He's in the final stages of a long and successful business career as head of RJS Associates LTD, a corporate financial consulting firm. In 2022, Ray received the Doc Driscoll Award from the Alumni Association for above-and-beyond service to Leo.



### Vets Ceremony November 3, 2023

Leo will stage its annual Veterans Observance on Friday, November 3 at 11 a.m.

The ceremony will take on added significance this year. A plaque honoring the late Corporal John P. Fardy will be unveiled, and the courtyard where Leo's Veterans Memorial is located will be designated the John P. Fardy Memorial Courtyard.

Corporal Fardy, a U.S. Marine who graduated from Leo in 1940, was posthumously awarded the Congressional Medal of Honor for heroism at the Battle for Okinawa during World War II. A grenade rolled into the trench where Corporal Fardy's platoon had taken cover during heavy fighting. Before it detonated, Corporal Fardy dove on the grenade, absorbing its full impact but sparing his men. He died of his wounds the next day.

Corporal Fardy is Leo's lone Medal of Honor recipient. Jim Furlong '65, a decorated Vietnam veteran, has spearheaded the efforts to have Corporal Fardy recognized.

The official holiday celebrating our nation's military men and women is November 11, observed on Friday, November 10 this year. But Leo has that day off for the holiday, so students would not be present if we were to salute our veterans on November 10.

Rather than have them miss out on this example of living history - the interactions between the students and the vets is always a program highlight - we have scheduled the event a week out from the actual holiday so our students can participate.

A reception will follow the ceremony in the newly renovated Leo cafeteria. Visitors are invited to come early and see the improvements we've made to the cafeteria and the entire first floor.



### Leo Update

#### Happening around Leo

We began the school year with our largest freshman class (82) and highest overall enrollment (230) in more than 20 years. The hard work of Admissions Director Kevin McNair has to be acknowledged; Kevin is a tireless recruiter who develops an easy rapport with prospective students and their parents and sells them on the value of a Leo education.

A generous gift from Sam Leno '63 and a grant which outgoing Congressman Bobby Rush helped us secure funded the expansion and refurbishment of the Brother Finch Science Wing on the second floor. Up to date STEM technology and equipment, a robotics component and modernized labs have helped create a more ambitious and attractive Science Department under the direction of Ms. Tenille Wright, STEM teacher and head of the Science Department.

Another grant, which Congressman Rush and State Rep. Mary Flowers helped us obtain, funded an extensive renovation of the cafeteria and other first-floor spaces. The highlights include new flooring throughout, new cafeteria fixtures and furniture, a tutoring center and new study cubicles.

Two dozen sophomores and juniors got a head start on the college selection process when they joined eight seniors and College Counselor Tiffany Harston on a tour of six college campuses in mid-September. Schools visited included Georgetown and Howard universities in Washington, D.C.; the University of Maryland-College Park and Bowie State in Maryland; Penn State University and the University of Cincinnati. The Leo party's host at Maryland was Dr. Quincy Mills, Principal Rawls' Leo classmate from the Class of '93 who is an associate professor of history at the school.

Principal Rawls served as MC, the world-renowned Leo Choir performed and three Leo students shared their personal stories at a St. Sabina "pep rally" designed to help save the Invest in Kids Act. The legislation funds the Tax Credit Scholarship program for lower-income students in Illinois. It's due to expire in 2024 unless the legislature votes to extend it. Leo has more than 30 students receiving tax-credit scholarships, including seniors Zion Cornell-Strickland and Theauntae Jones and freshman Ian White-Holmes, who told the gathering they probably would not be able to attend Leo without the scholarship.

Jones also delivered a "Spoken Word" poem to the audience at the Big Shoulders Fund Auxiliary Board Ball at the Wintrust Bank Events Space downtown on Sept. 29 ... On Sunday, Oct. 1, Cardinal Blase Cupich cited Leo in his homily at 9 a.m. Mass at Holy Name Cathedral, pointing out that the school's Facta non Verba motto—deeds not words—is an admirable example of living one's faith ... Finally, the World Renowned Leo Choir provided music for the annual Catholic Lawyers Guild Mass at the Cathedral on Oct. 4.

### Football in a word: Ugh!

A four-game losing streak against Marmion (42-14), DePaul Prep (38-14), St. Laurence (50-8) and De La Salle (48-6) saddled Leo with what seemed to be a 2-4 record.

To make matters worse, the Lions learned they'd been ordered to forfeit their season-opening, 20-19 victory over Bishop McNamara due to an eligibility issue. Leo allowed three transfer students from St. Laurence to play in the game, in the mistaken belief that their IHSA paperwork had cleared. It had not, so the players were technically ineligible. IHSA bylaws call for the forfeiture of any game in which ineligible players appear.

"No excuses," Leo President Dan McGrath said. "We thought the paperwork had cleared; it had not. The IHSA isn't interested in 'we thought' or 'inadvertent.' It exists to set policy and enforce rules, and we were in violation.

"It's disappointing, to say the least, but we have to be better and more aware.

"It will not happen again."

Better on the field as well. Granted, the Catholic League schedule is typically murderous, but the Lions have rarely been competitive during their four-game skid, often done in by their own miscues such as bad snaps on punts, fumbles and penalties.

"The execution has been lacking at times, but I won't fault our effort," first-year Coach Marques Stevenson said.

Junior Javon Logan has brought it every night, leading the Lions in rushing with 375 yards on 64 carries (5.9 average) and four touchdowns while catching 18 passes for 217 yards and two touchdowns.

Fellow junior Marshawn Durr has had his moments at quarterback. Injured in the Marmion game, he sat out against DePaul Prep, then returned to complete 14 of 28 passes for 125 yards with a touchdown and an interception against St. Laurence. Running for his life in the Homecoming loss to De La Salle, Durr piled up 109 rushing yards, but he misfired on eight straight passes after competing his first two and threw two interceptions.

Defensive highlights have been hard to come by for a

team that's been torched for 44 points per game during its losing streak, though it should be noted that bad or mishandled punt snaps led to five short-field touchdowns and a safety for the opposition.

"We have a lot of young guys at the skill positions, and we can expect them to get better with experience," Stevenson said. "Line play is what has to be shored up. That's the foundation where it all starts.

"When I was fortunate enough to land this job I promised that we'd have a program the Leo Family would be proud of," Stevenson added. "It's a process, slow at times, but that's what we're building toward."

#### **Annual Alumni Awards**

Once again it is time to ask you to provide the Alumni Association with nominations for our annual awards. These awards are open to nomination by all Leo High School graduates or current faculty members. Here is a brief summary of each of the awards given:

Man of the Year- Our most important award is reserved for an individual who has contributed to Leo in an extraordinary way. Many help our school, but this award is given to the individual who exemplifies what Facta non Verba truly means.

**Dr. Tom Driscoll-** Named after the man who went above and beyond the call of duty in helping make sure Leo remains the success that it is today. This award is given to an individual who has shown an extraordinary devotion to making sure that Leo carries on its great tradition.

Community Service- An Alumnus that is an outstanding example of contributing to the community. This is not specific to the Leo community, but to any area in which they lend their efforts.

Finally, the association, along with the school administration, is accepting nominees for the school's Hall of Fame. This honor is given to those who have given their time, talent or financial support to the school. Typically, six are nominated, so please make sure to add your nomination.

Nomination forms are available on our Alumni Association web-site, www.leoalumni.org, and need to be submitted by November 30th, and will be discussed at our December alumni meeting and voted on at our January meeting. The nominations need to be signed by the nominator and also provide contact information for the nominee.
